 Staff Reporter: E-learning has transformed education by offering flexibility and accessibility, allowing students to learn from anywhere at any time, which is especially beneficial for working

professionals or those with other commitments. Though traditional teaching is based in the classrooms with paper and pen, e-learning includes numerous types of media for delivering text, audio, images, animation, and streaming video etc. and it can occur in or out of the classroom. The delivery of education is made to a large number of recipients at the same or different times. One of the key advantages is that it eliminates geographical barriers, making education accessible to individuals in remote areas. Additionally, e-learning can be cost-effective as it reduces the need for physical infrastructure and transportation. There can be productive discussion between a teacher and a student irrespective of the place and time. However, elearning also has its drawbacks. Students may feel isolated as they miss out the face-to-face interactions with teachers and it can be an obstruction to the development of social skills of them. Sometimes students with lack of technical knowledge cannot deal with this fast method of teaching. Technical issues, such as poor internet connectivity, can also hinder this learning. For the subjects with practical experience it is not helpful. With all the convenience, it also comes with challenges that need to be addressed for optimal learning outcomes.
